From Technician to Leader: Building Cleanroom Culture and Advancing into the Designated Person Role

Pharmacy technicians are the operational backbone of sterile compounding programs, directly shaping both compliance and patient safety through their daily actions. This session connects two critical concepts: the formal responsibilities of the Designated Person under USP Chapter <797>, and the informal but powerful influence of cleanroom culture on performance, accountability, and consistency.

Attendees will explore how technician strengths in workflow management, documentation, environmental monitoring, aseptic technique, and communication naturally align with sterile compounding leadership roles. Beyond role responsibilities, the session will emphasize how behaviors, team dynamics, and peer accountability shape cleanroom culture, and how technicians can actively strengthen both compliance and consistency in real time.
